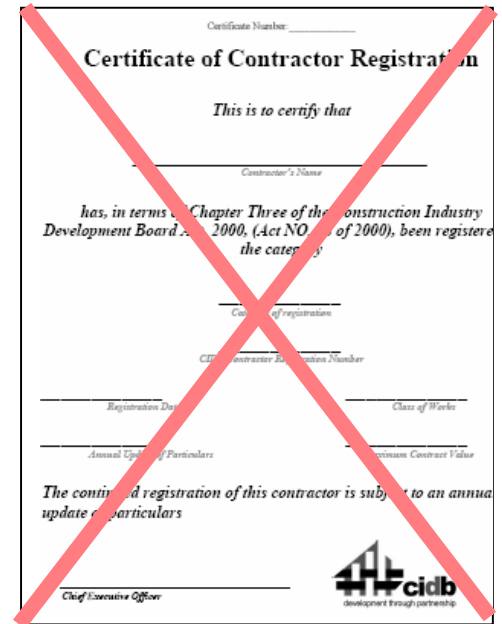


PROOF OF CONTRACTOR REGISTRATION

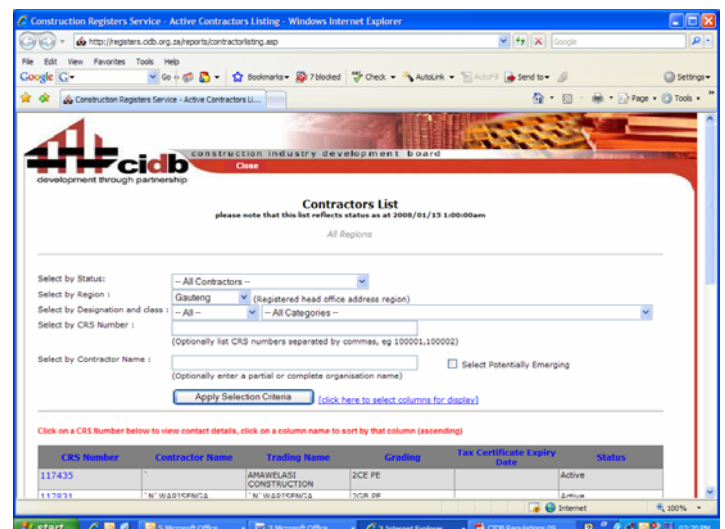

- 1 The **cidb** up until 31 December 2007, issued all registered contractors with a Certificate of Contractor Registration which served as proof of registration.
- 2 The **cidb** has discontinued this practice for grade 1 contractors and will be phasing it out for grade 2 to 9 contractors as:
 - a contractor's registration particulars may change from time to time;
 - all the information contained on the certificate is available on the **cidb** website www.cidb.org.za and is updated whenever a change in contractor particulars is made;
 - the website provides more information than that contained on the certificate of registration;
 - almost all public sector clients (or their agents) have access to the internet; and
 - certificates of registration can be forged.
- 3 The Standard for Uniformity in Construction Procurement requires that the Compulsory Enterprise Questionnaire contained in Annex L be used on all public sector construction works contracts. This questionnaire requires that the **cidb** registration number be inserted in the space provided in section 3. Clients can use this number (or the name of the contractor) to locate the registration particulars of a contractor on the **cidb** website.

- 4 The register is a searchable data base. It allows searches to take place on the basis of:
 - status (active or suspended)
 - the province in which the head office is registered
 - provinces in which a contractor has branches
 - the class of construction works
 - the financial capability designation
 - potentially emerging enterprise status
- 5 The website provides the name of the contractor, the trading name of the company, the contractor grading designation, the tax certificate expiry date, status (active or suspended), type of enterprise, registration date, contact person and contact details.
