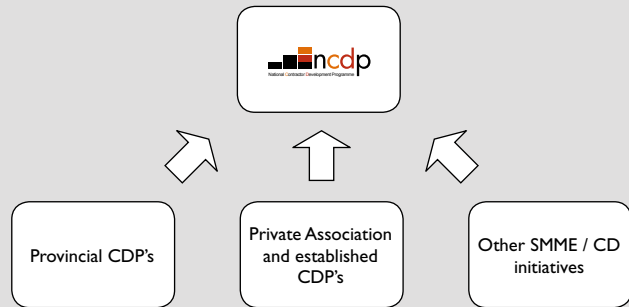
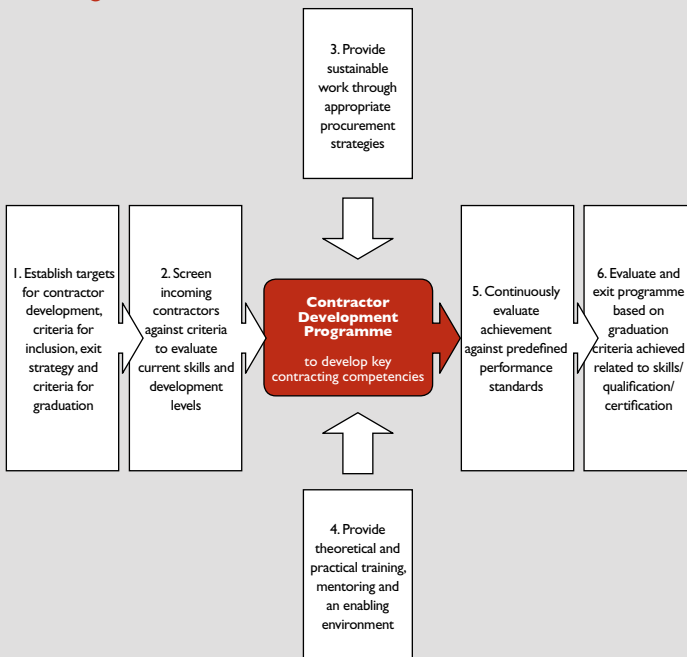

Background:

The **ncdp** is a government programme comprising of a partnership between the **cidb**, national and provincial public works and other willing stakeholders. The participating stakeholders commit their efforts and resources to develop previously disadvantaged contractors, by:

- establishing an enabling environment for contractor development;
- enhancing and strengthening contractor development mechanisms, including emerging contractor development programmes (ECDP's), joint ventures (JVs) and other appropriate mechanisms;
- facilitating performance improvement of contractors; and
- supporting the creation of a pool of skilled artisans, supervisors, technicians and technologists for the construction industry.

ncdp Objective:

The objective of the **ncdp** is to increase capacity, equity ownership, sustainability, quality and performance of **cidb** registered contractors – effectively raising the contribution of the construction industry to South Africa's accelerated economic and social growth objectives.

To achieve this objective, participants within the **ncdp** commit to:

- improve the grading status of contractors in targeted categories and grades;
- increase the number of black, women, disabled, and youth-owned companies in targeted categories;
- create sustainable contracting enterprises by enabling continuous work through a competitive process;
- improve the performance of contractors in terms of quality, employment practices, skills development, safety, health and the environment by rewarding performance; and
- improve the business management and technical skills of these contractors.

What is the role of **cidb** in **ncdp**?

- Develop and implement the Framework (**ncdp**)
- Best practice for the construction industry
- Support and guide provincial clients contractor development programmes (CDP's)
- Monitor and Evaluate of contractor development programmes
- Provide support by creating an enabling environment eg. Construction Contact Centres (CCC), best practice guides, delivery management support.
- Facilitate links, formal interactions and agreements or partnerships and catalytic interventions.

In support of the **ncdp**, the **cidb** will:

- develop guidelines which the programmes need to comply with as part of the **ncdp**. These cover assessment and selection of contractors, support mechanisms, accreditation of training providers and mentors, funding requirements and access to work opportunities, as well as accreditation of contractors on exiting the programmes;
- provide relevant information from the **cidb** Registers on capacity linked to demand and existing supply, and provide guidelines for targeting strategies;

What **cidb** and **ncdp** do not provide:

- **work / contracts** (however shape the procurement environment in support of Contractor Development)
- **training** (but provide catalytic support, and facilitate links)
- **funding/ finance** (but facilitate access to funding)

Role of Key Stakeholders:

A variety of stakeholders are involved in the **ncdp**, including:

- **cidb** which is responsible for:
 - facilitating and co-ordinating the implementation of the **ncdp**, and
 - providing guidelines and specific support;
- National Public Works which is responsible for:
 - supporting the **cidb** in facilitating and co-ordinating the implementation of the **ncdp**; and
 - aligning current and new contractor development programmes within National Public Works to the **ncdp**;
- Provincial Public Works which is responsible for:
 - aligning current and new contractor development programmes within provincial Public Works to the **ncdp**;
 - reporting on CDP targets and progress.
- Private Sector and Contractor Associations; facilitating contractor and skills development through training, mentoring;
- Banks and financing organisations; facilitating financing of working capital, insurance and performance guarantees for contractors; and
- CETA – For skills development
- Other stakeholders, willing to commit resources and support.

Benefits of participation in the **ncdp**:

Participating stakeholders within the **ncdp**, and specifically National and Provincial Public Works departments, commit to:

- make available and manage the budgets and resources necessary for their programmes;
- ensure that their programmes are being realised in accordance with the principles set out in the **ncdp** framework, meeting both the objectives of **ncdp** and their service delivery objectives;
- establish working relationships with other provincial and local public sector clients in the region and with private and other public sector emerging contractor development initiatives;
- prepare and present reports on their programmes to the **ncdp** Steering Committee; and
- prepare and recommend strategies and implementation plans to the **ncdp** Steering Committee which will ensure that the **ncdp** continuously and pro-actively responds to the changing influences it will be subjected to.
- provide opportunity for participants to increase awareness and visibility to their services
- launching joint projects
- knowledge transfer
- standardised services
- facilitate the exchange of best practices and expertise
- joint assessment of effectiveness of enterprise development policies
- sharing information on contractor performance
- use of **cidb** registers in targeting potential clients
- increasing clients base with pre-risk assessment analysis
- facilitates for ease of Sector Charter implementation (Empowerment, Contractor capacitation, Industry Development and streamlining and enterprise development)
- market and create visibility of services offered to contractors
- 'One stop shop' (Contractor, Client, Financiers and others)
- business to Business linkages & networking opportunities
- link to other existing Government or partnering stakeholders and resources eg. CCC, DTI-SEDA's / NHBRC.
- demonstrate to contractors that **cidb** and other sector players stand together i.e. **cidb** endorsement
